

IDAHO COUNTY REPUBLICAN CENTRAL COMMITTEE

Meeting Minutes January 20, 2026

The regular monthly meeting of the ICRCC was held at the Super 8 Motel in Grangeville on January 20, 2026. The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Chairman Vince Rundhaug.

Roll was taken and 20 members were present (17 in person + 3 on Zoom). We had a quorum.

PC Cam Lucas led the prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

The business agenda was unanimously approved.

The minutes of the December 16, 2025 meeting were approved unanimously.

Standing Committee Reports

Event Planning Committee Report

Committee Chair Patricia Menough reported there is no new information regarding the America 250 celebration in Idaho County.

Public Relations & Publicity Committee Report

Committee Chair Mary Mangold reported she has been working with the Lincoln Day Dinner Committee on event publicity. The LDD event flyer is on the ICRCC Face Book page and website. Mary has also been working with PC Scott Perrin in getting the event ticket QR code system operational.

Special Committee Reports

Special Committee – Zoom Committee

As requested at our December meeting, the Zoom Committee represented by PC Megan Turner gave the group information they gathered on a variety of Zoom camera systems and discussed the differences between an Owl system and the Zoom camera. PC Tim Christopherson moved to purchase the Owl at the best price possible. The motion was seconded and passed.

Special Committee – Lincoln Day Dinner Committee

Committee Chair PC Roy Farmer reported 13 tables have been purchased to date. Ticket sales are slower this year because of several conflicting events around the area. We need to work hard to sell more tickets!

PC Corey Koole is working on the table sales. He is also working on the games and drawings being held through the evening during the event and is in need of volunteers to help. Please let Corey know if you are available to help.

Committee Vice Chair PC Scott Perrin reported he has been fine tuning the online event ticket sales and the QR code is operational. If any PCs would like to go online and purchase tickets, he will be able to make sure that there are no issues with the process.

All PCs are asked to sell at least 6 tickets to the event. PCs are also asked gather 5 auction item donations from their respective area businesses by January 15th. PC Bruce Walker at Walker's Jewelry in Grangeville is the drop off location for auction items. Each auction item should also have a donation sheet attached. This sheet provides all of the information needed to comply with the Secretary of State regulations and it also ensures our donors are given proper recognition for their contributions.

Precinct Committeeman Election

Chairman Vince Rundhaug reminded PCs of the March 3-13, 2026 filing deadline for the upcoming election. He encouraged PCs to file or find a person from their precincts to file.

Winter GOP Meeting Report

New Business

Jill Manley Contribution

State Committeewoman Rose Pogue moved to have the ICRC make a contribution of \$1,000 to Jill Manley, Legislative Aide to Senator Cindy Carlson. The motion was seconded. PC Jason Hollinbaugh moved to amend the motion to increase the contribution to \$2,500. The amended motion was seconded and approved. The motion to have the ICRC contribute \$2,500 to Jill Manley, Legislative Aide to Senator Cindy Carlson passed.

Email Scams

Chairman Vince Rundhaug reminded the Committee of how he signs off on email communication. There has recently been scam emails sent out on his behalf.

Region 3 Legislative Review Committee

State Committeewoman Rose Pogue reported on the Region 3 LRC. They are proposing each of the 5 counties in Region 3 sign a memorandum of understanding and agree to pay a portion of the social media chat app used for their meetings. State Committeewoman Rose Pogue moved that the ICRC sign the Region 3 Legislative Review Committee MOU and pay \$18 for their portion of the yearly app expense. The motion was seconded and passed.

Chairman Vince Rundhaug shared a brochure produced by the State GOP explaining the purpose of a County Central Committee and the duties of a PC. The brochure will be sent out with the meeting minutes.
