

IDAHO COUNTY REPUBLICAN CENTRAL COMMITTEE

Meeting Minutes April 21, 2026

The regular monthly meeting of the ICRCC was held at the Super 8 Motel in Grangeville on March 21, 2026. The meeting was called to order at 6:01 p.m. by Chairman Vince Rundhaug.

Roll was taken and 20 members were present (18 in person + 2 on Zoom). We had a quorum.

PC Ron Frei led the prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

PC Joe Slichter moved to add Tyler Harrington to the business agenda. The motion was seconded and passed.

The minutes of the March 17, 2026 meeting were approved unanimously.

Standing Committee Reports

Event Planning Committee Report

Those candidates speaking at the meeting were State Senator candidate Cindy Carlson running unopposed, State Representative Seat A candidate Kyle Harris (running against Michael Collins who did not attend), and State Representative Seat B candidates Charlie Shepherd and Maureen Anderson. Each candidate spoke briefly and took questions from the committee.

School Board Member Report

Grangeville School Board member PC Roy Farmer gave a report on the upcoming school levy election. Grangeville School Board member Tyler Harrington and GHS Principal and Superintendent Amanda Bush were also in attendance to answer questions and explain details about the levy allocations.

Introductions of PC Candidates

Woodland PC Kim Kivela-Kalmukos will not be returning as PC from her precinct as she is moving out of the area. She introduced the two candidates who will be running to fill her position. Samuel Hohmann and Walt Willis both briefly spoke to the committee outlining their qualifications.

Region 3 Legislative Committee
